Pastor's Column

Why We Do Not Lose Hope

I watch the livestream of the 2024 General Conference in Charlotte, North Carolina, as I write this month's reflections. I must confess that I am not a particular fan of the legislative process in general. Yes, I fully realize that it is a necessary process, but that does not equate automatically great enthusiasm on my part. Observing how we get so often hung up in the minutiae of written or spoken words, large amounts of time and energy are expended for certain business items, and too little time on that which may be difficult or unpopular to deal with.

That doesn't take place at a global General Conference, of course, but also on the local and personal level from time to time. There is no conspiracy behind any of this, no intentional disinformation strategy, or any such things. We could chalk it up to the category of "it's in human nature" and accept it as a fact of everyday life.

What do we do with the incessant flood of images and reports that flood before our eyes and minds every single day of our lives, whether we search for them, or they come to us unbidden and as an intrusion? We are now such a connected world that anything happening in even the remotest part of the earth will become immediately newsworthy around the globe. I know that many people feel overwhelmed and helpless before the onslaught of non-stop news.

These things have been weighing on my mind a lot in recent weeks, and as I turn to Scripture for guidance and wisdom to handle the many issues before us as a world and as a society, I was reminded of some words in 2 Corinthians 4:16-18:

So we do not lose heart. Though our outer self is wasting away, our inner self is being renewed day by day. For this light momentary affliction is preparing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison, as we look not to the things that are seen but to the things that are unseen. For the things that are seen are transient, but the things that are unseen are eternal.

That is why we do not lose heart (or hope) in whatever situation we may find ourselves, because we focus on the things we cannot yet see, trusting in God our Creator to walk with us towards the future that only God knows is just beyond our horizon.

May God bless us and keep us as we live as people of trust and a future with hope.

Lay Leader's Corner

Greetings from the Lay Leader's Corner. Spring is here, the landscape is greening up and God continues to reveal his handiwork. It is time to take inventory and plan for the days ahead. The Michigan Conference of the United Methodist Church is doing just that. As I write this article, representatives of our Conference are attending General Conference, planning the future of the United Methodist Church in the world at large.

Cinda and I are looking forward to attending the Michigan Annual Conference at the end of this month at the Grand Traverse Resort in Acme Michigan. The MAC is a gathering of equal numbers of Clergy and Lay members of the Conference to do the Corporate business of the church. All clergy in good standing in the Conference, whether active or retired, are required to attend. Cinda was elected at our Annual Charge Conference last Fall as your Lay Representative to Annual Conference and I was chosen to be an Equalization Representative to Annual Conference by our District Lay Leader. Note, because there are more clergy attendees than there would be lay representatives elected by local congregations, and equal numbers of each are required by *The Book of Discipline*, a number of lay people need to be chosen on a district-by-district basis to "equalize" the numbers, thus, the Equalization Representatives. Well, that was a lot of explanation of why both Cinda and I will be attending as your representatives, but I felt it is important for you know.

Also important for you to know is what "business" will be before us and what your part is in accomplishing that "business". There are eleven Resolutions that have been presented and a budget for the Conference to consider. Three of the Resolutions and the budget will come before the entire voting body to be considered for discussion and vote. The remaining eight will first go through Legislative Committees for consideration before coming before the entire body. It is that process you can help with.

On May 22 and 23, four Legislative Committees will meet separately via Zoom to consider those pieces of legislation, two per committee. Pastor Daniel, Cinda and I will each be assigned to one of those groups, but no two of us to the same group. The pieces of legislation and budget have been posted in the RCUMC narthex for your examination. Also, you can access the Michigan Conference web sight and find them there. You are strongly encouraged to examine these documents and provide Pastor Daniel, Cinda, and/or me with your thoughts, feelings, and wisdom. Cinda and I will be in the Fellowship Hall each Sunday after service to discuss your questions and or comments. It is through your input, prayers, and God's guidance that we will do God's work at Annual Conference.

You will be able to follow the actions of Annual Conference as it happens via the Conference website, YouTube, and Facebook page. There is much more to Annual Conference than the legislative sessions; worship, fellowship, information booths on a myriad of topics, seeing old friends, and making new friends. A round-up of each day's activities will be published in Newsletter form the following day on the web sight and Facebook page as well. At a time to be determined after the Annual Conference there will be a time set aside to present a report to the congregation from those of us that attended.


Fellowship & Bible Study Opportunities

Matthew Dickerson is a national champion, performer, and entertainer on the Hammered Dulcimer. Matthew began playing the hammered dulcimer at the young age of 15 on a homemade instrument he had constructed from a water damaged piano. His push for progress and talent led him to compete in the Mideast Regional Hammered Dulcimer Competition in 2012, which he won. Shortly thereafter he also

went on to compete in and win the 2012 National Hammered Dulcimer Championship at the Walnut Valley Festival in Winfield, Kansas.

Matthew's fun, personal, and candid stage presence has taken him across America and overseas to share his talent. His performances offer a delightful compilation of crowd favorites, from traditional to classical and from oldies to 100% original. He released his first album in the summer of 2014 (When I'm Happy And I Know It), and his second (So Sings My Strings) in the summer of 2018. Matthew continued to work on his music and his efforts paid off in 2020 when his music video, Come Thou Fount, went viral on Facebook.

With a genuine appreciation for great music and talent in multiple genres, he continues to reach for new heights in both style and performance as he represents himself as one of the best dulcimer players in the world.

Matthew currently resides in Evans, GA with his family of 7.



Do Crew and Leadership volunteers assembled to repair the church lawn after snowplow damage last winter; lawn mowers have been serviced and sharpened and will be put to use, shortly. 'Do Crew' and other volunteers will soon "spring clean" our memorial garden, and preparations are being planned to replace storm windows with screens and do some pressure-washing and curb painting in our parking lot.
