A Half Century of Offering Christ to Our Community

On October 29, 2023, Reed City UMC will celebrate a half century of ministry in its present building and location. As a congregation, our history reaches back much further to 1867, but this year we are focusing on the past 50 years, 1973-2023. During this relatively brief span of 50 years momentous events took place in the life of the Reed City UMC as well as in the world at large. Here is just a glimpse of what happened in the world in 1973.

Gasoline was 40 cents a gallon, and a dozen eggs could be had for 45 cents. By October of that year, OPEC will drastically reduce the production of crude oil, increasing the price by 200%.

In Paris, France, the United States ends its involvement in the Vietnam War by signing a peace treaty, ending almost 20 years of hostilities.

Roe vs. Wade makes abortion an US constitutional right.

Oglala Lakota Native Americans and members of the American Indian Movement (AIM) began their occupation of Wounded Knee in South Dakota that February, highlighting the continuing discrimination against the first peoples in America.

Britain, Ireland, and Denmark join the European Union.

NASA launches the Mariner 10 Mercury probe spacecraft.

The Sears Tower in Chicago is completed in May of 1973.

So much for a few of the events that were happening in the United States and the rest of the world in the year the Reed City UMC moved into its new location and building.

The Reverend Forrest E. Mohr was serving in Reed City during the building and dedication of our present church facility, and since then, 8 pastors have served you during this half century of worship and ministry.

We are at present putting together a PowerPoint presentation for a 'show-and-tell' time during and after our celebration on the 29th of October.

We will share stories and memories of all the great things God has done in our midst and through our presence in this community.

And, ... we will re-dedicate our beautiful church facility <u>and</u> ourselves as a congregation to making a difference in Reed City and beyond in the <u>next</u> half century!

Operation Christmas Child Shoeboxes Due November 12th

A small shoebox can have a big impact. What goes into the box is fun, but what comes out of it is eternal. Be a part of changing children's lives all over the world in Jesus' name through the power of a simple gift with



Operation Christmas Child. What can you pack in your box? First, decide the age level of the child for whom you will be buying. A box going to an infant would be significantly different in contents than that of a teenager! Also, you are to pack a box specifically for a boy or a girl, so gender-appropriate toys are recommended. Shoeboxes are available in the church narthex, along with pamphlets which contain the envelope to put your check in. Suggested items to put in the box include toys, school supplies, non-liquid hygiene items such as toothbrushes, bar soap, combs, washcloths. You also can pack socks, hats, sunglasses, hair accessories and watches. If you send a flashlight, include extra batteries. Soccer balls (always a favorite) should be deflated to make more room. Toothpaste is not an accepted shoe-

box item. <u>Please have your packed shoebox at the church no later than</u>

<u>Sunday, November 12th. Please enclose a check (NO CASH) for \$10 in each box made payable to Samaritan's Purse</u>. <u>Please place your check IN THE SHOEBOX, and NOT in the Sunday offering. Thank you.</u>

We look for your prayers as we continue deliberations for the person who will staff our church office. That person's job description will change, but our need for caring and concern will be a primary consideration in choosing the right person who will fill this position.

Leadership Team is also planning for a transition of its own, in some subtle changes to the governance structure of our church. There are ministry teams to construct, and positions to fill as we shift gears slightly to shift our focus from less "hands on" to more "visioning and planning." Please consider saying "yes" to our Nominations Team as they look to fill spots on ministry teams. Don't fear a "forever assignment!" Be open to the opportunity to serve and share your talents and spiritual gifts with a level of commitment that leaves some wiggle room. Our church needs all of us to share in the work of an active and vital organization that honors God and walks as Christ's hands and feet in our community!

Other considerations for discussion and requesting your input: What are we doing right? How are we connecting with our online worshippers and radio listeners?

Where can we make improvements, considering any constraints in staffing/volunteers and with limited finances?

How can we, at this time of concern with inflation and economic uncertainty, step up our congregational participation in giving and stewardship?

Are there things we should be engaging in, or things that have probably run their course and should be discontinued?

Your responses are encouraged and important as we think about the next 5-10 years. Time for thinking and discussing! Our resources are valuable.

There are no easy answers to our questions—but it is a certainty that we need everyone to share in the responsibility and sharing of ideas to make things work. Your presence on this journey is vital, and we look forward to walking with you, every step of the way!

The church administrative assistant is primarily responsible to provide support to the pastor and to the church body, by conducting secretarial, administrative and informational activities in an organized and efficient manner. The administrative assistant serves God and the church, and in this capacity, is expected to treat all persons with compassion and respect. As the first point of contact for the church, the administrative assistant is expected to be warm and caring in communicating and interacting with church family and strangers alike. The administrative assistant should be a Christian and live accordingly. The ideal candidate will have experience in a similar role as well as excellent communication skills and the ability to work independently.


